were there made up of 25 ILCA 4's (formerly the Laser 4.7), 91 ILCA 6's (formerly the Laser Radial), and 46 ILCA 7's (formerly the Laser Full Rig). In the ILCA 4's, San Diego YC's Kousei Hatter came out on top with a three point margin over Jackson Wilcox. The competition was tight and four points separated the first four places. Kyla Benesch of Florida's Coral Reef YC seemed to be headed for victory until a disqualification in the penultimate race proved too much to overcome.

The ILCA 6 is the Women's singlehanded dinghy for the 2024 Olympics, so there is always a lot of interest among aspiring female sailors. The class is also popular among teens who aren't yet ready for the larger ILCA 7. Jaje Homberger from the Lauderdale Yacht Club won four of the eight races to edge out Tanner Krygsveld from the St. Thomas
